EMCP Regulations

What is EMCP?

The Enrichment Mini-Courses Program is a unique annual event in the world of Canadian education. Students from grade 8 to 11 are given the opportunity of exploring a field of study or area of interest in a university or college setting. These students acquire knowledge and skills that will help them achieve academic success and stimulate their interest in pursuing post-secondary studies.

Program Admission and Registration:

The mini-courses are open to those students from grades 8 to 11 in Ontario and secondary levels II to V in Quebec who have demonstrated excellent academic performance, and whose school board or private school is a participating member of the program.

Students are selected by the school and they will receive a username and password to register. Student placement is based on a random computerized process that occurs once all the application forms are received. Consequently, the first come - first serve principle does not apply.

Who is Eligible?

- A student who demonstrates excellent academic achievement in all subjects covered in the school year or term.
- A student who demonstrates excellent behavior.
- A Student who demonstrates good citizenship towards the school, staff, and fellow students.
- A student who has not received any time-out sheets, recurrent warnings, or suspension.
- A student who was not involved in any major incidents or conflicts that can jeopardize his/her eligibility.

To ensure fair representation of all eligible students, the school concluded:

- A student who's eligible to attend EMCP, can be entitled **once** throughout grade 8-10.
- Siblings cannot attend the EMCP during the same year. Priority will be given to the older child.

Student Behaviour

Students must attend the course for which they were placed, and attendance is taken every day. Non-attendance is reported to the professor or to the person responsible for the Enrichment Mini-Courses Program in the host institution.

Students who attend the mini-courses are expected to demonstrate interest in the subject they are taking and to participate in class activities. Disruptive behaviour is not tolerated. Students who do not respect acceptable rules of behaviour will be sent back to their school. The decision to do so is irrevocable.

Each mini-course runs five hours a day, Monday through Friday. Courses start at 9 A.M. and end at 3 P.M., with one hour for lunch.

Bursaries of the Enrichment Mini-Courses Program

Students who have participated in the Enrichment Mini-Courses Program in the past and who are accepted full-time into the first year of a regular program offered by one of the participating post-secondary institutions stand a chance of receiving the Enrichment Mini-Courses Program's Bursaries available yearly.

Orientation Information

Each year before the Mini-Course week kicks off, the universities and the college providing the courses hold short orientation sessions on their campuses.

What happens?

The students and their parents are introduced to the campuses. More specifically, students find out where their course will take place during the mini-courses week. They and their parents meet their course instructors and have an opportunity to talk about the courses and ask some questions. Light refreshments are served at the end of the session, and there is time to talk with program administrators.
